Semester & Academic Year Programs 2022-23

The semester and academic year programs at Salzburg College are designed to allow students to truly immerse themselves into the Austrian culture and German language. It is our mission to support students in feeling as though they have truly relocated their life and education to Central Europe and have become part of the local culture. At Salzburg College classroom work, field study, workplace experience and academic travel complement one another. Students are encouraged to make their personal experiences part of their academic studies. Experiential learning constitutes an important component of all our semester and academic year programs, one of the major reasons why we require all academic year students to complete an internship.

Special COVID-19 modifications: The semester dates have been modified to allow for a visa-free entry and stay. The arrival dates are flexible. Students may begin their coursework virtually and later in the semester seamlessly transition from live-remote instruction to classroom instruction. If a self-quarantine period should be required again by Austria and/or the European Union for incoming travelers, students may arrive at their chosen accommodation in Salzburg, go straight into self-quarantine and follow classes virtually.

Excursions

The day trip to Munich/Bavaria (Germany) allows students to complete the first phase of cultural adaptation, and to learn to navigate a larger European city incl. public transportation. The day trip to Vienna takes place in the later part of the semester. Much of what has been studied in "The European Experience" can be experienced in the country's capital. A wide variety of additional local excursions constitute an integral part of the academic program. There is also ample time set aside for independent travel.

Housing

To maximize cultural involvement, students live in our new downtown serviced student dormitory where they also take their breakfasts. Grocery stores, markets, pharmacies, coffee shops & restaurants are all in easy walking distance. Due to COVID-19 family accommodation is not available until further notice.

Eligibility

- Freshman standing or higher
- Minimum GPA of 2.7

Program Fee

The program fee is comprised of tuition, study abroad fee, room and breakfast, mandatory health & liability insurance, course-related excursions, numerous day trips and, various local excursions.

The fee does not include travel insurance, passport fees and transatlantic transportation. Additional fees on behalf of the home institution or consortium may apply.
