### **Admission Requirements**

This program is open to students who have a strong interest in immersing themselves in European culture and heritage. Applicants must be 18 years of age or older at the program start date. To be considered for admission, students must meet the following minimum admission requirements.

- Approval and recommendation of applicant's campus ICISP representative.
- Successful completion of the application process is required for admission to the program.
- If a participant has special needs, the program will make reasonable accommodations.

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## Academics

Students Will enroll in 1 course per session, earning 3-4 credit hours.

- All classes are taught in English (except German), and students receive regular US credit for their work.
- Summer students enroll in one class per session.
- Classes run for 3 weeks; week 1 is delivered online at home and weeks 2 and 3 are taken in person in Austria.

Field trips and excursions constitute an important part of the academic experience at Salzburg College. Summer students will take trips to:

## **Pre-Departure Orientation**

Participation in a pre-departure orientation is mandatory. The orientation will be held approximately six weeks prior to departure. Details will be sent upon acceptance. Salzburg College provides an online and in-country orientation as well.

## **Passport and Visa**

Students will need to acquire or have a current passport before departure. Applicants should allow at least 8 weeks for standard passport processing. An application and information can be acquired at your local post office or at travel.state.gov. Passports must be valid for six months after the program ends.



# Housing and Meals

The cost of housing is included in the program fee. Students can choose to live with local Austrian families, or in a dorm with double occupancy and shared bathroom. Wi-Fi is available in each location. Laundry is included. Also included are 2 meals per day, M-F in the dorms

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# Fees and Payment

The cost of the summer program for 2025 is \$3502 for 1 session and \$6652 for 2 sessions.

A \$500 deposit, taken off the total program cost, is due with the completed application form and is subject to the cancellation and refund policy as outlined in the application. Please submit all payments to the ICISP representative at the applicant's home institution before the orientation day. Payments must be made on schedule, or the student risks being dropped from the

program.

Applications must be received at the ICISP office by the posted deadline. Late applications may be accepted if space allows and at the discretion of the coordinator.
