A personal interview with the program coordinator may be held to determine the participant's maturity and adaptability to a foreign environment. Successful completion of the application process is required for admission to the program. If a participant has special needs, the program will attempt to make reasonable accommodations within the capacity available at ICS. Disability accommodations will vary according to need and what can reasonably be provided by a foreign institution. It may be difficult for those with severe physical disabilities to travel to and within Spain due to differing legal requirements for accommodations in country.

Program Summary


The Illinois Consortium for International Studies and Programs (ICISP) is pleased to provide a semester-long study abroad program at the <u>International College</u> of Seville (ICS) in Seville, Spain.

<u>Seville, Spain</u>, is the quintessential Andalusian Spanish city, on the banks of the Guadalquivir River. With a population of 700,000, Seville is home to three UNESCO World Heritage sites. Portugal, Morocco, Madrid and Barcelona are all easily accessible by various modes of transportation.

Admission Requirements

This program is open to serious students who have a strong interest in immersing themselves in Spanish culture and heritage. Applicants must be 18 years of age or older as of the program start date. The minimum age requirement is strictly upheld. To be considered for admission, students must meet the following minimum admissions requirements:

- completion of at least 12 hours of college-level coursework;
- completion of English Composition or its equivalent with a B or better;



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Academics

Students will enroll full time, earning 12 – 18 semester credits.

REQUIRED. All students in this program must enroll in Culture and Society of Spain (3 credits), a course which provides students with an introduction to the history, culture, and people of Spain. This course includes field trips and a forum for inquiry into the country they reside in for the academic term.

SPANISH LANGUAGE. Students will also enroll in a sequence of Spanish language courses. Placement will be determined by assessment upon arrival. Beginner and Intermediate semester sequences include 3 courses (9 credits total). Advanced students will enroll in Advanced Composition & Conversation course (3 credits).

NOTE: Culture and Society of Spain (3 credits) plus Beginner or Intermediate Spanish language sequence (9 credits) constitutes full enrollment (12 credits).

ELECTIVES. Students may enroll in 1-2 courses offered by ICS, EUSA, and the University of Seville (US). Language of instruction and tuition varies by location.



Cultural Excursions

The foundation of the program is the various cultural excursions included as part of the Culture and Society of Spain course. The program includes trips to Cordoba, Morocco and faculty-led tours of local museums, Alcazar, the cathedral and various Sevillian neighborhoods.

The cost of transportation and entry fees for all cultural excursions are included in the program cost.

Housing and Meals

The cost of housing is included in the program fee. Students live with local Sevillian families, in a **single room with shared bathroom**. There is a second student in the apartment. Wi-Fi is available in each home but fast bandwidth is not a guarantee. Laundry and linens are included in the program.

Also included in the **home-stay is 21 meals per week**, including the option to request a "meal to go" when necessary.



Faculty Liaison

Most spring semesters, a faculty member from an ICISP member institution is on-site in Seville to serve as a faculty liaison to students, the ICS faculty and administration, and ICISP. While this individual will be a support for students, s/he will also provide service to ICS as a visiting professor or in another mutually agreed upon capacity.



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Pre-Departure Orientation

Participation in a pre-departure orientation is mandatory. The orientation will be held approximately six to eight weeks prior to departure. Details will be sent upon acceptance. ICS provides an in-country orientation as well.

Passport and Visa

Students will need to acquire or have a current passport before departure. Applicants should allow at least eight weeks for standard passport processing. An application and information can be acquired at your local post office or at travel.state.gov. Passports must be valid for six months after the program ends.

A visa is necessary for fall and spring semesters and is a responsibility of the student to acquire prior to departure.

Fees and Payment

The cost of the **semester program** for the 2023-2024 academic year varies depending on the choice of electives:

- ICS courses only or a combination of ICS/US (University of Seville) courses—program cost is \$10,870.
- ICS/EUSA program cost is \$12,640.

A \$500 deposit, taken off the total program cost, is due with the completed application form and subject to the cancellation and refund policy as outlined in the application.

Please submit all payments to the ICISP representative at the applicant's home institution. Final payments must be made to the home institution prior to the orientation date. Payments must be made on schedule or the student risks being dropped from the program.

The application deadlines are

- May 15 for the fall,
- October 15 for the spring,
- Feb 15 for summer.

Applications must be received at the ICISP office by this date. Late applications may be accepted if space allows and at the discretion of the coordinator.
