

BOARD POLICY

03.20.00 TUITION WAIVER FOR STUDENT TRUSTEE

In recognition of the duties and responsibilities of the appointed Joliet Junior College Student Trustee, representing Joliet Junior College and its student body, which include but are not limited to attending IBHE and ICCB student advisory meetings off campus throughout the academic year, the Student Trustee holding this position will be awarded a tuition waiver as defined herein. The receipt of this tuition waiver will not preclude the Student Trustee from receiving additional benefits, including a stipend, that may be awarded at the sole discretion of the Joliet Junior College Board of Trustees. This tuition waiver will be in effect during the fall and spring semesters of their appointment, and will not exceed the value of twelve (12) credit hours of in-district tuition and fees for each of those semesters. Student Trustees will receive these awards for the semesters in which they hold the Student Trustee position at the beginning of the appropriate semester.

If the position is vacated before the end of an academic term, then the person taking over the position may be awarded a prorated waiver at the discretion of the Vice President for Student Development. Additionally, if the Student Trustee vacates/leaves the Office before the end of the semester, the Student Trustee will be responsible for repaying Joliet Junior College any tuition waiver or stipend awarded during the appropriate semester, unless the Vice-President of Student Development determines that exigent circumstances and good cause exist for waiving said repayment.

Recipients must meet the criteria of enrollment and academic and student conduct standards, for their offices, as outlined in the Student Trustee-Qualifications and Selection Procedure 01.35.00.01. This Section does not prohibit a student member of the board from maintaining official status as an enrolled student, from maintaining normal student employment at the college, or from receiving scholarships or grants when the eligibility for the scholarships or grants is not determined by the board.
