

### Headcount/Credit Hours

The Fall 2013 census headcount is 16,870, up 8.2% from last Fall (+1,281 students). Credit hours for Fall 2013 are up 2.2% from last Fall (+3,082.0 credit hours). The number of students enrolling in at least one web-based course has increased from 3,151 students for the Fall 2012 census to 3,263 students in Fall 2013 (+3.6%).

### Enrollment by Full-Time/Part-Time Status

Part-time students represent 65.3% of the Fall 2013 census headcount, this is a 15.1% increase (+1,445 part-time students) from Fall 2012. JJC witnessed a 2.7% decrease to the number of full-time students for Fall 2013. This represents a decrease of 164 full-time students from the Fall 2012 census of 6,013 full-time students.

### Enrollment by Gender and Ethnicity

Please see table 4.0 on the following page for the breakdown of the unduplicated headcount by ethnicity and gender.

The number of male credit students has increased by 13.5% (+928 males) from the previous Fall term. The overall percent of males for the Fall 2013 census is 46.2%, this represents a 2.2 percentage point increase change from the 44.0% proportion of males represented in Fall 2012.

The minority population at JJC represents 35.9% of the total census headcount for Fall 2013, this represents the same proportion in relation to the Fall 2012 census. For the Fall 2013 census Black Non-Hispanic students witnessed a decrease of 0.5% (-8 students) from the previous Fall census, while the Hispanic population has seen an 11.2% increase for Fall 2013 (+378 students), and the White Non-Hispanic student population has increased by 9.2% (+876 students) over the last Fall census. *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.*

### Enrollment by Age

Over twenty-nine percent (29.6%) of the Fall 2013 students are 25 years of age or older representing a 5.4 percentage point decrease from the 35.0% represented at the Fall 2012 census for this age category. The largest number change is the 17-20 age category with an increase of 1,136 students (+16.4%). The full-time and part-time average ages for Fall 2013 are 21.3 and 26.3 years respectively, resulting in an overall average age of 24.6 years of age. Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.

The majority of increase for the "16 & Under" and "17-20" age categories can be attributed to the number of students generating Dual Credit registered as of census for the current Fall term.

### Enrollment by Registration Status

The number of continuing students has decreased by 193 students (-2.1%) from the previous Fall term. JJC has witnessed a 6.6% decrease to the number of returning students (-201). Data definitions: New Freshman – A student not previously enrolled in college; New Pre-College – includes early entry and dual credit; Transfer – a student entering JJC having earned credit at another college/university; Continuing – A student who has enrolled at JJC the previous term (for Fall, the previous term includes spring or summer); Returning – a student who has enrolled at JJC previously but not in the previous term (for Fall term, the previous term includes spring or summer). *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.*

### Enrollment by Original Intent

Nearly fifty percent (49.7%) of students on census have “Transfer” to a four-year college or university as their original the intent selected at time of application, up 762 student (+10.0%) from the Fall 2012 census. More than eleven percent (11.5%) of students has an unknown intent, an increase of 59.6% (+729 students) over the Fall 2012 census.
