**2012 Spring Census Report  
(Unduplicated Totals)**

**Headcount/Credit Hours**

The unduplicated Spring 2012 headcount is 16,079, down 1.8% from last Spring (-300 students). Credit hours for Spring 2012 are down 2.5% from last Spring (-3,595.5 credit hours). The number of students enrolling in at least one web-based course (excludes blended course sections) has increased from 2,838 students for the Spring 2011 census to 3,100 students in Spring 2012 (+9.2%).

**Enrollment by Full-Time/Part-Time Status**

Part-time students represent 64.5% of the Spring 2012 census headcount, this is a 7.3% decrease (-823 part-time students) from Spring 2011. JJC witnessed a 10.1% increase to the number of full-time students for Spring 2012 (5,703 full-time students), this is an increase of 523 full-time students from the Spring 2011 census of 5,180 full-time students.

**Enrollment by Gender and Ethnicity**

The number of female credit students has decreased by 3.3% (-309 females) from the previous Spring term. Females make up 55.4% of the Spring 2012 census headcount.

The minority population at JJC represents 36.5% of the total census headcount for Spring 2012. For the Spring 2012 census Black Non-Hispanic students witnessed an increase of 0.8% (+15 students) from the previous Spring census, while the Hispanic population has seen a 4.1% increase for Spring 2012 (+129 students), and the White Non-Hispanic student population has decreased by 3.3% (-340 students) over the last Spring census. The total minority population for the Spring 2012 census is 5,684 – up 2.1% from the prior year's census. *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.*

**Enrollment by Age**

Thirty-seven and one-half percent (37.5%) of the Spring 2012 credit students are 25 years of age or older representing a 1.7% decrease from 39.2% at the 2011 Spring census for the 25 and older population. The largest number change is represented by the 21-24 age category with an increase of 231 students (+7.8%). The overall average age of credit students at JJC for Spring 2012 is 26.2 years of age. The overall average age decreased by 0.3 years for the previous Spring census of 26.5 years. *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.*

**Enrollment by Registration Status**

The number of continuing students has decreased by 290 students (-2.6%) from the previous Spring term. JJC has witnessed a 2.7% increase to the number of returning students (+27). An increase of 4.7% (+61) was witnessed to new freshman. Data definitions: New Freshman – a student not previously enrolled in college; New Pre-College – includes early entry and dual credit; Transfer – a student entering JJC having earned credit at another college/university; Continuing – a student who has enrolled at JJC the previous term; Returning – a student who has enrolled at JJC previously but not in the previous term. *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.*
