

Headcount/Credit Hours

The unduplicated Spring 2013 census headcount is 17,706, up 10.1% from last Spring (+1,627 students). Credit hours for Spring 2013 are up 0.35% from last Spring (+506.0 credit hours). The number of students enrolling in at least one web-based course (excludes blended course sections) has increased from 3,100 students for the Spring 2012 census to 3,259 students in Spring 2013 (+5.1%). Credit Hours has increased by 0.4% from the previous census (+506 credit hours), the 142,427.0 hours equates to a *full-time equivalency* (fte) of 9,495 for the 2013 Spring census (fte equals total credit hours generated divided by 15.0).

Enrollment by Full-Time/Part-Time Status

Part-time students represent 70.0% of the Spring 2013 census headcount, this is a 19.6% increase (+2,033 part-time students) from Spring 2012. JJC witnessed a 7.1% decrease to the number of full-time students for Spring 2013 (-406 full-time students).

Enrollment by Gender and Ethnicity

The number of female credit students has increased by 8.4% (+745 females) from the previous Spring term census. Females make up 54.5% of the Spring 2013 census headcount.

The minority population at JJC represents 35.2% of the total census headcount for Spring 2013. During the Spring 2013 census Black Non-Hispanic students witnessed a decrease of 4.1% (-80 students) from the previous Spring census, while the Hispanic population has witnessed a 16.5% increase for Spring 2013 (+535 students), and the White Non-Hispanic student population has increased by 11.2% (+1,107 students) over the prior Spring census. The total minority population for the Spring 2013 census is 6,234 – up 9.7% from the prior year's census. *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.*

Enrollment by Age

Just under twenty-eight percent (27.9%) of the Spring 2013 credit students are 25 years of age or older representing a 9.6% decrease from 37.5% represented at the 2012 Spring census for the 25 and older population. The largest number change is represented by the 16 & Under age category with an increase of 1,317 students (+712.0%). The overall average age of credit students at JJC for Spring 2013 is 24.7 years of age. The overall average age decreased by 1.5 years from the previous Spring census of 26.2 years. *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.*

Enrollment by Registration Status

The number of continuing students has decreased by 153 students (-1.4%) from the previous Spring term. JJC has witnessed a 3.0% decrease to the number of returning students (-86). A decrease of 8.1% (-111) was witnessed to new freshman. New Pre-College students witnessed a 224.5% increase over the prior year's census (+2,007 students). Data definitions: New Freshman – a student not previously enrolled in college; New Pre-College – includes early entry and dual credit; Transfer – a student entering JJC having earned credit at another college/university; Continuing – a student who has enrolled at JJC the previous term; Returning – a student who has enrolled at JJC previously but not in the previous term. *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.*
