#### Headcount and Full-time Equivalency (FTE) Enrollment

The unduplicated Spring 2015 census headcount is 15,888, down 3.0% from last Spring (-487 students). The number of students enrolling in at least one web-based course (excludes blended course sections) has declined in for the 2015 Spring term; on the 2014 Spring census 3,256 students enrolled in at least one web-based course compared to 2,977 at census for Spring 2015 representing a –8.6% change to headcount. Credit Hours have decreased by 3.3% from the previous Spring census (-4,485.0 credit hours), the 129,951.5 credit hours for the current census equates to a *Full-time Equivalency* (FTE\*) of 8,663 for the 2015 Spring census (-299 FTE).

Headcount and FTE enrollment trends are represented in figures 1.0-Headcount Enrollment at Joliet Junior College and 2.0- Full-time Equivalent (FTE) Enrollment at Joliet Junior College on the following pages.

\*FTE is equal to the number of credits generated divided by 15.0


# **Enrollment by Full-Time/Part-Time Status**

Part-time students represent more nearly seventy-two percent (71.6%) of the Spring 2015 census headcount, this is a headcount increase of 23 (+0.2% part-time students) from Spring 2014. JJC witnessed a 10.2% decrease to the number of full-time students for Spring 2015 (-510 full-time students).

### **Enrollment by Gender and Race/Ethnicity**




Figure 4.0-Headcount Enrollment Gender Spring Census 2011-2015

The number of female credit students has decreased 4.5% (-407 females) from the previous Spring term census. Females make up 54.0% of the Spring 2015 census headcount. Fewer males have also enrolled for Spring 2015 down 1.1% (-80 students). Figure 4.0 below represents the enrollment trends over the 5 most recent Spring terms.

During the Spring 2015 census Black Non-Hispanic students witnessed a decrease of 6.0% (-99 students) from the previous Spring census, the Hispanic population witnessed a 1.3% increase for Spring 2015 (+45 students), and the White Non-Hispanic student population decreased by 4.4% (-453 students) over the prior Spring census. The total minority population for the Spring 2015 census is 5,783 – nearly identical to the prior year's census. *Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.* Table 1.0 below represents the change in headcount by race/ethnicity over the 5 most recent spring terms. Overall the minority population represents 36.4% of the total census headcount for Spring 2015 at JJC. Figure 5.0 on the following page represents the minority enrollment population as a percent of the overall student population on Spring census.

Figure 5.0-Minority Headcount Enrollment as a Percent of Overall Student Population Spring Census 2011-2015



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## **Enrollment by Age Spring Census 2011-2015**

Just over twenty-eight percent (26.2%) of the Spring 2015 credit students are 25 years of age or older representing a 2.0% decrease from 28.1% represented at the 2014 Spring census for the 25 and older population. The largest number change is represented by the "16 & Under" age category with an decrease of 204 students (-27.1%). 


### **Enrollment by Registration Status Spring Census 2011-2015**

The number of continuing students has decreased by 425 students (-4.2%) from the previous Spring term. JJC has witnessed a 1.1% decrease to the number of returning students (-26). A decrease of 8.8% (-329) was witnessed to new freshman. New Pre-College students witnessed a 3.3% increase from the prior year's census (+88 students). Transfer students decreased by 30 students representing a 13.6% decline. Data definitions: New Freshman – a student not previously enrolled in college; New Pre-College – includes early entry, dual credit, and ABE/ESL/GED; Transfer – a student entering JJC having earned credit at another college/university; Continuing – a student who has enrolled at JJC the previous term; Returning – a student who has enrolled at JJC previously but not in the previous term. Please note small number changes can result in large percent changes for groups with low counts.





Figure 9.0-Headcount Enrollment Certificate/Degree Objective Spring Census 2011-2015
