

MakerLab COVID-19 Protocols

Welcome back to MakerLab. We are happy to see you.

In order to ensure safety at MakerLab the following policies have been established.

- Use of MakerLab is by appointment only, no walk-ins will be accommodated
- Each person is required to enter using one of the designated entry points at JJC Main Campus*
- Each person entering MakerLab is required to sign in and sign out on the daily attendance log.
- Masks are required at all times. They are to cover both your nose and mouth when wearing. Masks, along with hand sanitizer, will be available upon arrival at the JJC campus entrance.
- If you wish to wear gloves you will need to provide your own.
- MakerLab users will be expected to wipe down any area used within the MakerLab. Wipes and solution will be provided.

Please make sure to read the information carefully and watch the video outlining the COVID-19 safety measures on campus.

*Please note: The college has installed hands free thermometers at key points of entry at Main Campus (Buildings A, U, G and J). These devices read a person's temperature at their ear ducts. Fever is considered 100.4 or higher.

Monday through Thursday:

A-Building (bell tower front door)**

G-Building

U-Building (closes for entry at 2 p.m.)**

J-Building (closes for entry at 2 p.m.)

****U and A are the closest doors to the MakerLab**

Immediately inside the designated entry areas on campus there are charts with information regarding symptoms of COVID-19 as outlined by the CDC. Please take time to review the chart each time you enter campus. If you are symptom free, you may proceed toward the hands free thermometer device for a temperature reading. Alternatively, a member of the campus police department or a designated campus greeter may use a hand held thermometer to determine your temperature. The thermometers are strategically placed so that only the guest and the thermometer attendant will see the temperature reading. The temperature check is a requirement upon entering campus. If a temperature reading is 100.4 or greater, you will be given an information card and asked to leave campus and make contact with the designated campus representative via phone or email for further instructions.
