The following outlines the criteria for consideration:

- Applicants must attend an academic institution within the state of Illinois.
- College Student with a minimum 2.5 G.P.A. on 4.0 scale
- Any female or any minority as defined by the US Government as identified in 30 ILCS 575/2 found at;

- Pursuing a degree in Technology, Architecture, or Engineering
- Complete, signed, and dated application including:
 - Copy of College transcript(s) (Official or Unofficial)
 - List of extra-curricular Activities (i.e. sports, student organizations, etc.)
 - Latest tax information (held confidentially at USMCA office)
- 2 letters of reference
 - One reference from a faculty or staff member who can support your educational excellence and extra-curricular activities.
 - One reference from a community leader or employer who can support your work ethic or community service.

Scholarship applications and supporting materials are accepted throughout the year but evaluated only in March and October for selection.

To ensure the integrity of the selection process, applicants must meet all requirements and **incomplete applications will not be considered**. Please note that materials submitted will not be returned. The number of scholarships awarded is dependent available funds based on fundraising success.
