INTRODUCTION TO THE SCHOLARSHIP LISTINGS

Approximately 1.6 million undocumented students under the age of 18 are currently living in the United States, 65,000 of whom will graduate each year from high school (Passal, 2003). Access to higher education is an issue that continues to plague students, parents, high school counselors and college admission officers. Unfortunately, confusion exists not only with regard to whether colleges may admit undocumented students but also what type of financial aid, if any, can be offered. As a result, high school counselors are often unsure how to best guide undocumented students because many are unaware of the options available. It is uncertain how many undocumented students attend college after high school. Of those who have lived in the U.S. for at least 5 years the figure is estimated to be 5 to 10 percent (National Immigration Law Center, 2009).

No federal or state law prohibits colleges and universities from offering admission to undocumented students. However, undocumented students are not eligible to receive federal or state aid. Undocumented students may be eligible to receive privately funded merit scholarships or grant aid. Illinois is one of 10 states with an in-state tuition bill Public Act 93-0007 also referred to as House Bill 60, which was signed into law in 2003. This bill permits undocumented students to pay in-state tuition rates at all public colleges and universities provided they meet the following requirements:

- (1) The individual resided with his or her parent or guardian while attending a public or private high school in Illinois.
- (2) The individual graduated from a public or private high school or received the equivalent of a high school diploma in Illinois.
- (3) The individual attended school in Illinois for at least 3 years as of the date the individual graduated from high school or received the equivalent of a high school diploma.
- (4) In the case of an individual who is not a citizen or a permanent resident of the United States, the individual provides the University with an affidavit stating that the individual will file an application to become a permanent resident of the United States at earliest opportunity the individual is eligible to do so (<http://www.ilga.gov/legislation/publicacts/fulltext.asp?Name=093-0007>)

I. THINGS TO KNOW BEFORE BEGINNING YOUR SEARCH

A lot of scholarships are listed here, and that means there's money available for YOU to go to college! Here are some easy steps to help you apply for the scholarships that you qualify for. Applying for scholarships takes time and effort, but in the end, you might get some money for school. So:

1. Look through the entire scholarship list below.
2. Look at the requirements and pay attention to all scholarships that you're interested in **AND** you qualify for. (If you don't qualify for it, don't apply for it.)
3. Click on the links under *Web Address* for each scholarship you circled in order to check current information.
4. If there's no link, but there's a phone number, call the organization. Here's a phone script to help you with your call:

Hi. My name is _____ and I'm calling about the _____ scholarship. I'd like to complete an application and would like to know some more details. Can I please speak with the scholarship director or person responsible for the scholarship program? I would like to know more information about:

- *The requirements for this scholarship: _____*
- *The deadline for submitting my application: _____*
- *Can I submit my application online, through email, or through the mail? _____*
- *If I have further questions, who should I contact? _____*
- *Thank you very much for your help. I look forward to submitting my application.*

5. If the link doesn't bring you directly to the scholarship application, type the name of the scholarship into the search box of the organization's website or search for the scholarship in an Internet search engine.
6. **CHECK THE REQUIREMENTS** of the scholarship application. Make sure you still qualify.
7. **CHECK THE DEADLINE** and write it down somewhere to remind yourself later. (This is a good chance to write it in your planner or calendar in your cell phone.)
8. Gather all of the items you need to apply for this scholarship. Check out our Resource Guide and Tutorials at www.scholarshipsaz.org to help you find/write these items: SCHOLARSHIP ESSAY; PERSONAL STATEMENT; LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION; RESUME
9. Complete application requirements and SAVE all your written work on your computer. You might need it later for another application.
10. Review your essays, statements, and all written work BEFORE submitting. Send it to someone else so they can revise it with you. The scholarship committee is going to read your work so it has to look good.
11. Submit your application and write down the date when you should be contacted about it.

The great majority of the scholarships listed are open to ALL students regardless of immigration status. A few are listed which require LPR or citizenship status because they are particularly intended to serve recent immigrant students.

II. QUESTIONS TO ASK WHEN...

RESEARCHING COLLEGES AND DEVELOPING A LIST

- ✓ Are there any state laws which bar undocumented students from public colleges or universities?
- ✓ Does the college or university admit undocumented students?
- ✓ Does the university require students to submit a social security number and proof of residency?
- ✓ Is there a point person in admissions that the student/counselor can contact with questions?
- ✓ Are other undocumented students enrolled in the college/university?
- ✓ Does the institution have a policy regarding whether or not it will report undocumented students?
- ✓ Will the institution consider undocumented students for institutional or private aid?
- ✓ Is an undocumented student eligible for merit aid?
- ✓ Does the institution offer any special scholarships for international students? Can undocumented students apply for these scholarships?

COMPLETING APPLICATIONS

- ✓ Does the application ask for a social security number?
- ✓ If a student does not have a social security number should they use zeros or leave it blank?
- ✓ Does the application have an appropriate “box” for an undocumented student on the section that asks about citizenship?
- ✓ If a student does not/can not answer all of the questions on the on-line application will it be submitted or do they need to complete a paper application?
- ✓ Can a student submit an on-line application if they are using a fee waiver?

APPLYING FOR FINANCIAL AID AND SCHOLARSHIPS

- ✓ Does the institution require all applicants, even those who are undocumented, to complete a FAFSA in order to be considered for private or institutional scholarships?
- ✓ Will the institution accept the College Board CSS Profile or an institutional form in place of the FAFSA?
- ✓ What other forms must be completed?

CONSIDERING MAJORS

- ✓ Does the major require a background check?
- ✓ Does the major lead to certification or state licensure for which an undocumented student would be ineligible?
- ✓ Are advisors and career development staff aware of these

SENIORS

TIME TO COMMIT:

During March and April, you will be hearing from colleges about your applications, be sure that once you make your decision, you let the school know as soon as possible! You **MUST** inform the college that you will be attending by May 1. This is important because colleges will begin to go to their waitlists as they learn whether their accepted students are planning to attend.

WAITLISTS:

Though you may feel that you're in purgatory because you've been waitlisted, here is some advice:

- Reply immediately. Your enthusiasm and commitment to the college is one of the best messages you can send. Besides, if you change your mind later, you can always take your name off their list.
- Make a decision among the schools that did admit you. Waiting can seem endless, and you need to plan for the next four years. Think about where you want to go and be sure you deposit by May 1. Some schools don't take anyone from the waitlist; some don't let you know they've stopped taking students until June 30.

FINAL GRADES:

Some colleges may ask for your final grades as they come to admission decisions. Stay focused through the spring! Maintain the grade record you established when you applied. If your academic record has slipped, they can consider withdrawing your admission and/or request that you attend summer school.

JUNIORS

TESTING:

At this point, all juniors should know which standardized tests they are taking and all should be registered for the appropriate tests. Summer experiences, scholarships, and colleges look at these scores, so do your best and prepare with online prep tests:

APPENDIX D

THE ILLINOIS DREAM ACT: WHAT IT DOES AND DOES NOT DO

The Urban Institute estimates that 65,000 undocumented students graduate from U.S. high schools every year. And according to the Pew Hispanic Center, out of the 18-24 year olds who have graduated from high school, almost half of undocumented students (49%) are in college or have attended college as compared to 71% of US born students.

Illinois HB60, passed in 2003, made in-state tuition available to undocumented youth at public colleges and universities in Illinois. To qualify for in-state tuition, the student must have

- 1) resided with his or her parent or guardian while attending a public or private Illinois high school;
- 2) graduated from a public or private high school or received the equivalent of a high school diploma in Illinois (the GED);
- 3) attended school in Illinois for at least three years from the date they graduated from high school or received their GED; and
- 4) must provide the university with an affidavit stating that the student will file to become a permanent resident of the US at the earliest opportunity of eligibility.

Then in May of 2011, the General Assembly passed the **Illinois DREAM Act**. Although the Act doesn't provide a legal pathway to citizenship, it provides a framework within which undocumented students can more easily access higher education.

The **Illinois DREAM Act**...

- a) allows anyone with a tax number to participate in the State Treasurer's College Savings Pool and the Illinois Prepaid Tuition Plan, thereby allowing families to dedicate savings to their children's future education;
- b) requires that high school college guidance counselors receive training in how to meet the needs of undocumented students;
- c) requires the Illinois Student Assistance Commission to establish a DREAM Fund Commission to oversee the Act's provisions. The DREAM Fund Commission will provide scholarships funded entirely by private donors and contributions.

The aforementioned Commission is responsible for overseeing fundraising for the fund; establishing, publicizing, and administering scholarships for qualified students; researching educational opportunities for immigrant youth; and assures undocumented students access to certain state college savings programs administered by the State Treasurer such as Bright Start* and Bright Directions.* To qualify for these programs one must have an Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN). The ITIN is not the same thing as the FAFSA which is only available to students who are permanent legal residents or citizens.

To qualify for the benefits of the **Illinois DREAM Act**, the student must fulfill requirements #1 and #3 under HB60 and have at least one parent who immigrated to the US. An ITIN is not required to receive scholarships awarded by the Illinois DREAM Fund.

The **Illinois DREAM Act** does NOT provide either a driver's certificate or a path to citizenship.
